IMPORTANT – Parents' Responsibilities

The club cannot be responsible for supervising your children outside the organised sessions on Saturday mornings and Monday evenings. Sessions may be cancelled in the event of bad weather so parents should make sure a session is on before leaving their children at the gates. The Club is not responsible for children once they leave the club grounds.

Parents of Juniors will be required give an emergency contact number and to complete a medical declaration for each junior member to be used in the case of an emergency.

Types of Junior membership & costs

Mini Tennis - £25* (10 and under, at 1st April.)

Junior - £75 (Aged 10 to 18.)

Junior Intermediate - £96 (Junior players who have reached adult standard and by nomination of the junior committee can play during adult sessions and represent the senior teams in matches.)

There is also a family rate and the club always welcomes new players of any standard. Annual membership runs from 1st April to 31st March. If you are joining from May onwards, we can adjust your membership fee pro-rata based on the number of months remaining to the following March. Contact the Membership Secretary, Mark Cant, for more details.

* The Mini Tennis membership fee is levied in addition to a £2 per session coaching charge. The Junior fee includes 1 hours free coaching per week.
